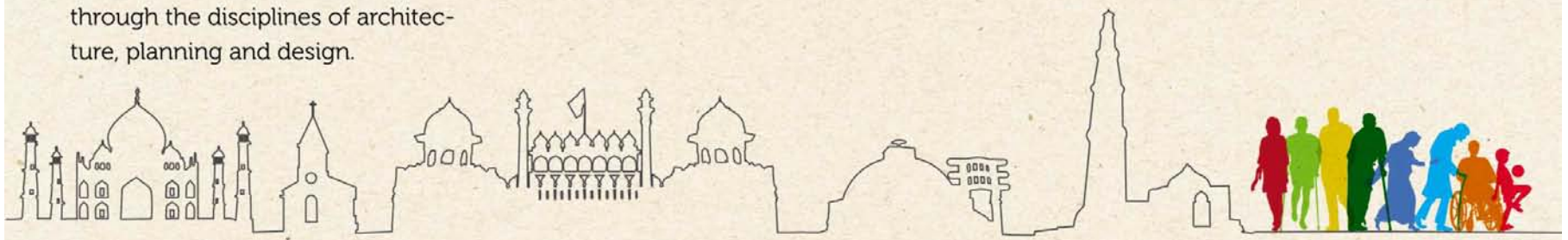

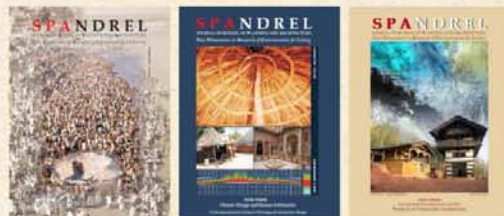

Universal design is an emerging concept in India, the roots of which are grounded in democracy, equal opportunity and self reliance.
